FINANCIAL GUARANTEE NOTES OF GUIDANCE

All students are required to return a satisfactory financial guarantee form before they can be formally accepted. **The completed form should be returned to your prospective SCHOOL OF STUDY**

The typical annual financial requirement are expected to be as follows:

(1) TUITION FEES 2004/5

£ 8,200 for students in Arts, Social Science and Management Schools
£ 10,500 for students in Science Schools

Students registered for research degrees (MPhil/Ph.D) may be charged an additional sum (bench fees) as a contribution towards laboratory and related expenses. Please contact your relevant School of Study concerned which will provide further information.

LIVING EXPENSES

In addition to tuition fees, single students will need approximately £550 per month or £6500 per year to cover accommodation, food, heating, laundry, clothing, books, and all day to day requirements. Married students will need to allow at least £1200 a year for a partner, and at least £515 for each child. These figures are estimates - actual costs will vary according to individual circumstances. These costs exclude return travel from the home country to the United Kingdom and also exclude the costs of any medical insurance students may wish to provide for themselves over and above British medical cover.

Please note the estimated costs for 2005/6 will need a small adjustment from year to year in line with inflation. Annual increases in both tuition fees and maintenance costs should be included in estimating the financial commitment required to cover the period of study.
